WORKS/San Jose presents a one-person exhibition by Morgan O'Hara entitled "Time, Space, Knowledge," March 1 - 31. O'Hara is a visual artist who draws on her own and others' life experiences to create extended portraits / explorations of the human use of time and space.

In conjunction with O'Hara's exhibition, WORKS/San Jose presents the world premiere performance of her work as music, in which she collaborates with noted composer and violinist Malcolm Goldstein and non-traditional creator of events Alison Knowles.

Goldstein has been active in the presentation of "new music" since the early 1960s, and has concertized extensively throughout the United States and Europe.

Alison Knowles has collaborated with John Cage and was a member of the Fluxus group. Her work concerns communication among human beings and involves a profound appreciation of the esthetic qualities of ordinary objects/events.

The opening for Morgan O'Hara is on March 9, 7 - 10 p.m. Two entirely different Goldstein/Knowles performances take place on March 30 (8 p.m.) and March 31 (7 p.m.). Performance tickets are \$6.50 at the door only.

WORKS is located in downtown San Jose at 248 Auzerais Ave. at Vine St., just one block south of the San Jose Center for the Performing Arts. Regular gallery hours are Tuesday through Saturday, 12 - 4 p.m.
